VETERAN AWARD





Graham Weatherspoon is a retired N.Y.P.D. Officer and also served with the N.Y.C. Transit Police Department Detective Bureau's Major Case Unit. Graham is a certified investigator with the N.Y.P.D., the State of New York and the F.B.I in the areas of homicide, sex crimes, robberies, forgery, fingerprint classification, and latent prints. He also was summoned immediately after 9/11 to assist in securing billions of dollars in bearer bonds at 1 World Trade Center. Graham is a founding member of 100 Blacks in Law

Enforcement Who Care, has been involved in the Amadou Diallo, Sean Bell and Ramarley Graham murder cases, among many others, in defense of individuals victimized by police brutality. He has advised the New York City Council and the Conference of New York State Supreme Court Judges on police procedures and conduct.

Currently he is serving on the board of the Amadou Diallo Foundation, providing scholarships to students and seeking better relations between the community and the police department and aiding in an investigation of a police officer who shot and killed an innocent young man fifteen years ago.

He regularly appears on Manhattan Neighborhood Network Cable's "The Gilchrist Experience". He has appeared on Brooklyn BCAT TV's Black Men Screaming, Hannity and Combs, Geraldo, Montel Williams, Court T.V., WYNC Radio, Al Jazeera TV, National Public Radio, Pacifica, WBAI, Democracy Now, KISS FM, WWRL, and WLIB. The BBC and independent producers of, "Giuliani Time", "365 Days of Protest", BET'S "50 Shots", and "If I Die Tonight" have interviewed Graham for documentaries. He has lectured at numerous CUNY and SUNY Colleges, Quinnipiac and Hofstra Schools of Law, as well as various public schools throughout the City of New York.

Along with other members of the International Christian Brotherhood of Christian Cultural Center, he serves as a mentor at Eagle Academy, Queens. Graham is a Born Again Christian and member of Christian Cultural Center (CCC), the CCC Choir and the International Christian Brotherhood, under the pastorate of Rev. Dr. A.R. Bernard.
