

Andre McDonnell was born in St. Michaels, Barbados, and came to Brooklyn, NY, at the age of five, with his parents and two younger sisters. In 2012, after playing basketball with friends, Andre spotted a homeless man with no shoes on his feet. A sense of urgency came over him that nudged his soul to take action. This nudge prompted Andre to take the sneakers off his own feet and offer them to this gentleman. Feeling the gravel under his feet, nothing compared with the immense gratitude Andre experienced with this small act of kindness, as the man returned a smile. Andre knew in his heart there had to be something more he could do to make the walk through life a bit easier for others. Compelled to

create a charitable movement, Andre began collecting donations and created a process for sneaker distribution that resulted in founding **It's from the Sole (IFTS)** which means to give from the soul of your heart, to the sole of your feet.

Soon after, IFTS attracted media attention and sneaker donations poured in from many other contributors with footwear they no longer wanted. For the first two and a half years Andre handled the collection, cleaning and distribution alone and at his own expense. He now recruits high school and college students, to support some aspects of the work, teaching them how to give back while performing community service for a cool organization. From the positive feedback he has been receiving, and most importantly, the expressions of appreciation, Andre believes his small grassroots movement is poised for future growth.

ITFS' next step is to affiliate with local retailers, footwear brands, churches, civic and non-profit organizations. He believes that learning the operations of this business, will enable him to spread the message of rebuilding the integrity and dignity of the homeless population far and wide.

Among a host of national and local media coverage, Andre's efforts have been featured on Ellen (2019) and CNN. To date, IFTS, has given out over 26,000 pair of sneakers to the homeless and less fortunate individuals domestically and internationally. Andre has distributed sneakers in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Alabama, Texas, Puerto Rico, Washington DC, Oregon, and California. He has also had global impact by donating goods in Guyana, Jamaica, Barbados, Haiti, London, Paris, Colombia, Israel, and Uganda. He has won awards that include Yahoo's Nicest Man in Fashion Award 2014, a 2015 NAACP Award, the Danny Glover Power of Dreams 2017 Humanitarian Award, the Black Entertainment Magazine Modern Man of the Year 2017 and the Fashion 500 Award.

POINT OF LIGHT AWARD



Kenny Carter was born in Queens and grew up in South Jamaica, Queens. In 1988 after moving from shelters and welfare hotels with his mother and siblings, they were placed in Queensbridge housing projects, the largest housing projects in America. During Kenny's development, Kenny became involved in gangs and drug activities which landed him in jail during his teenage years. Kenny was 17 when he was offered an alternative to incarceration program. While Kenny was in Phoenix House he obtained a high school diploma. After the completion of the program he continued to identify avenues that would allow him to help and serve others. At the age of 19 he became one of the youngest junior substance

abuse counselors in this field of work. Kenny endured a heart wrenching personal ordeal and in 2006 he gave his life to Christ and joined Christian Cultural Center located in Brooklyn, NY.

After the murder of Sean Bell he became an advocate for the people in his community. Kenny participated in protests and rallies for justice against police brutality, as well as organized Marches for "ENOUGH OF US KILLING US", which is the slogan used by Fathers Alive In The Hood (F.A.I.T.H). In 2011 Kenny founded F.A.I.T.H Since then Kenny has been an advocate to end street violence, police brutality and domestic violence. Today Kenny addresses the issues of the fatherless by providing mentorship services to at risk youth and troubled teens. Kenny believes fatherlessness is one of the roots to violence in our communities. Kenny Carter and members of his organization have been consistent in implementing their program approach in communities such as: Queens Bridge Houses, Astoria Houses, South Jamaica Houses, Redfern Houses, Ocean Bay Houses, Hammel Houses, and the Pink Houses and Seth Low Houses in Brooklyn, NY.

CIVIC LEADERSHIP AWARD



Monica Bartley, Master's in Special Studies (MSS), Advanced Certificate in Disability Studies, is a Community Outreach Specialist at the Center for Independence of the Disabled, New York (CIDNY). She has worked on promoting social justice for people with disabilities for much of her adult life. She leads the CIDNY Action Network (CAN) to educate people with disabilities and help them become leaders in community advocacy. Ms. Bartley organizes CAN member visits with legislators, trains people to survey polling sites, street access, restaurants and green markets. Her voting rights advocacy efforts contributed to a civil rights victory in the federal courts for people with disabilities in New

York City. As a child with a disability it ignited her drive to be a pioneer of the disability rights movement in Jamaica.

Ms. Bartley worships at Bethany United Methodist Church in Brooklyn where she assists with the Media Ministry, the Youth Confirmation class and she is the President of the local unit of Bethany United Methodist Women.

Her faith journey began from childhood nurtured by her grandmother who encouraged her to have faith in God and prayed fervently for healing after she became disabled. During her youth, God's word made an indelible impression on Monica. Attending Sunday school and church with her family was an integral part of her life and continue to characterize her faith journey.

She was awarded the 2019 Driven Women Award by Playbook MG. Patricia was also just awarded the 2019 Female Leadership Award by the Lower East Side Girls Club in which she serves as the Executive Director for Colin Kaepernick's "Know Your Rights Camp". In the capacity of Executive Director, she works with Colin and the team to coordinate camps that provide free campaigns for youth adults ages 14-18 across the country through social activism strategies, education, financial literacy, law advocacy/education, health and wellness and community leadership.

Patricia holds a Master's of Management and Human Resources and a Bachelor's in Business and Finance, and she is a certified HR professional. She is also a licensed Public Notary and a Public Notary Real Estate Agent.

Patricia has achieved a wide array of career achievements demonstrated by her robust work ethic, but her passion and enthusiasm, coupled with her sense of humility, organically platforms her as the highly respected professional that she is today.
